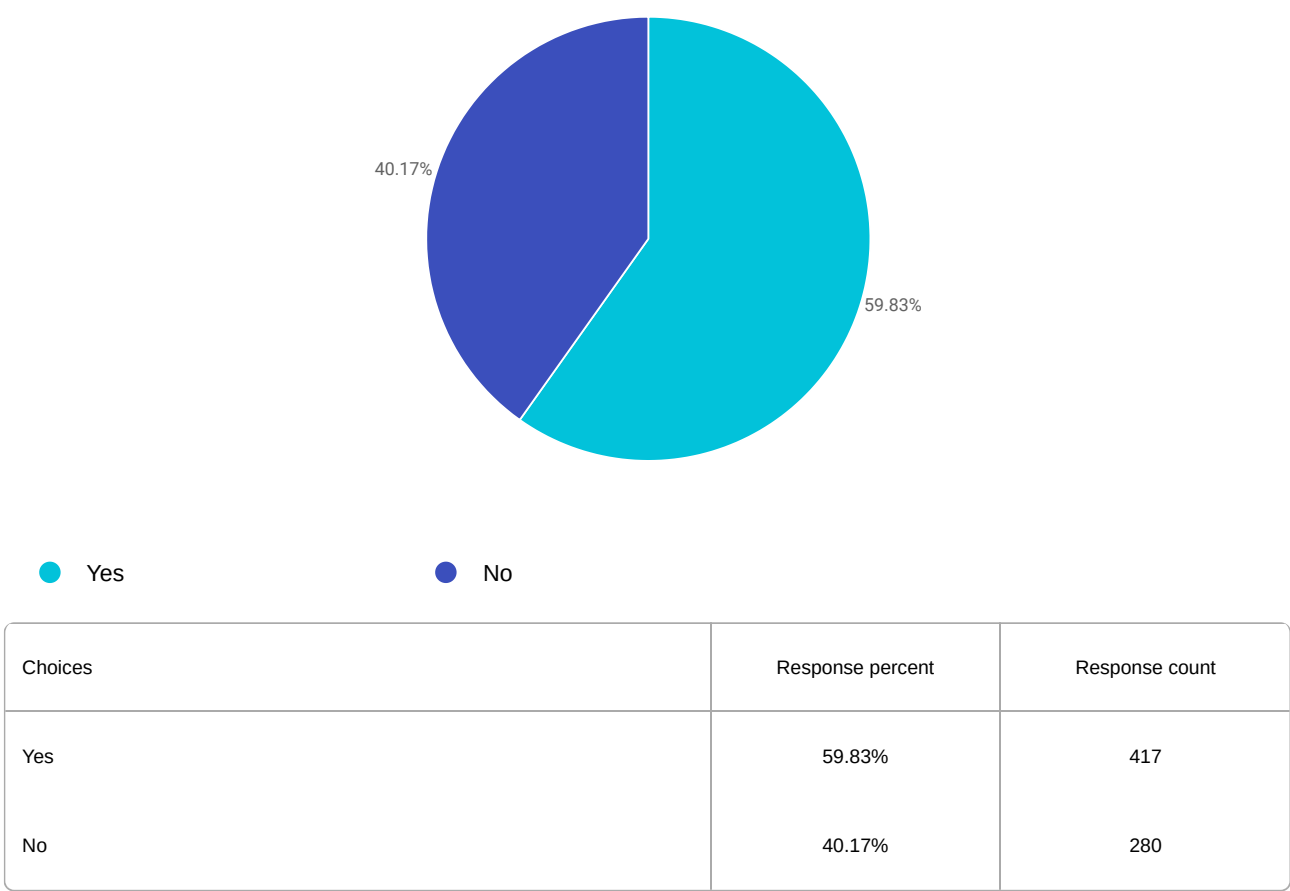

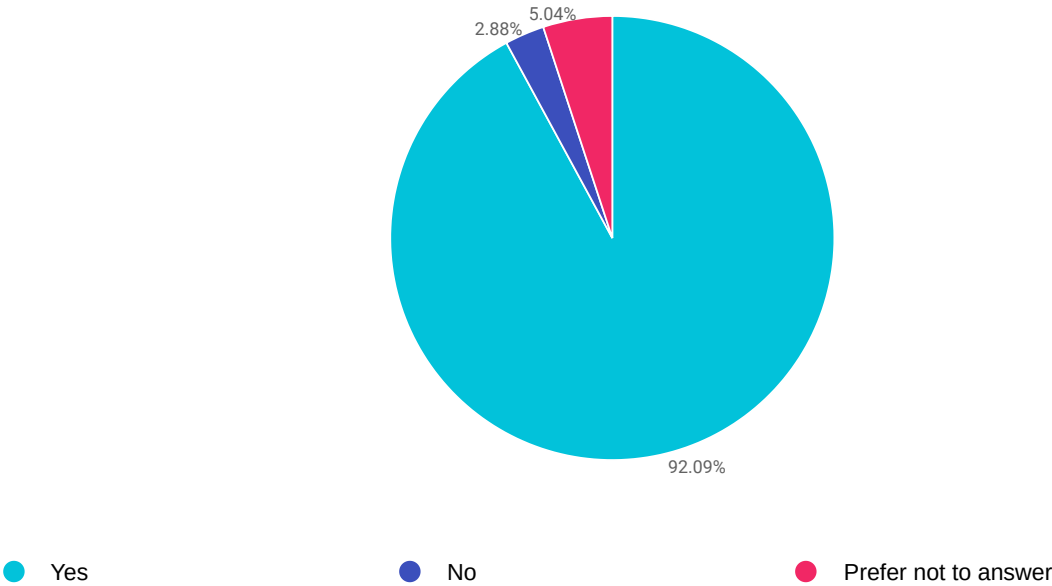

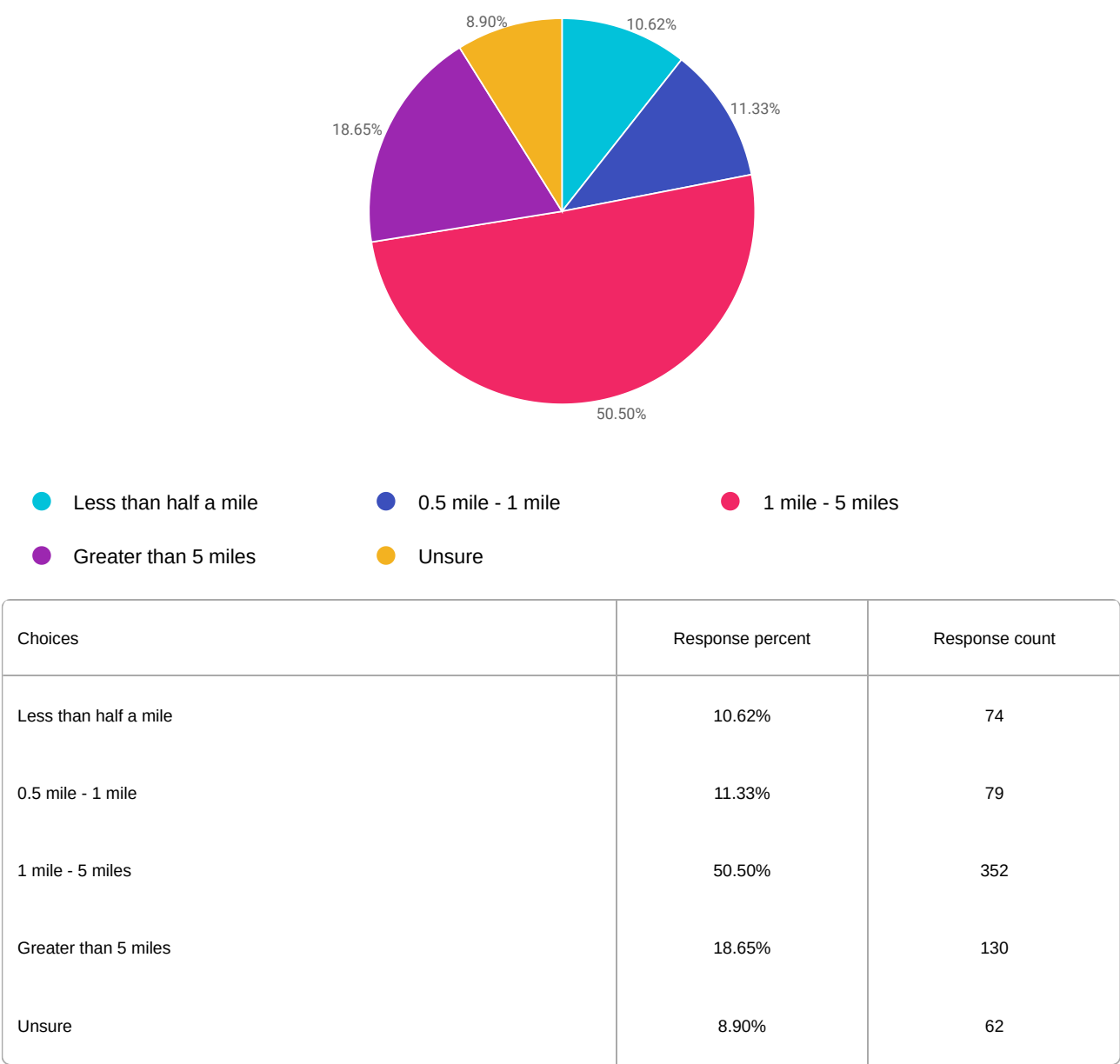

How close do you live to the proposed data center site?

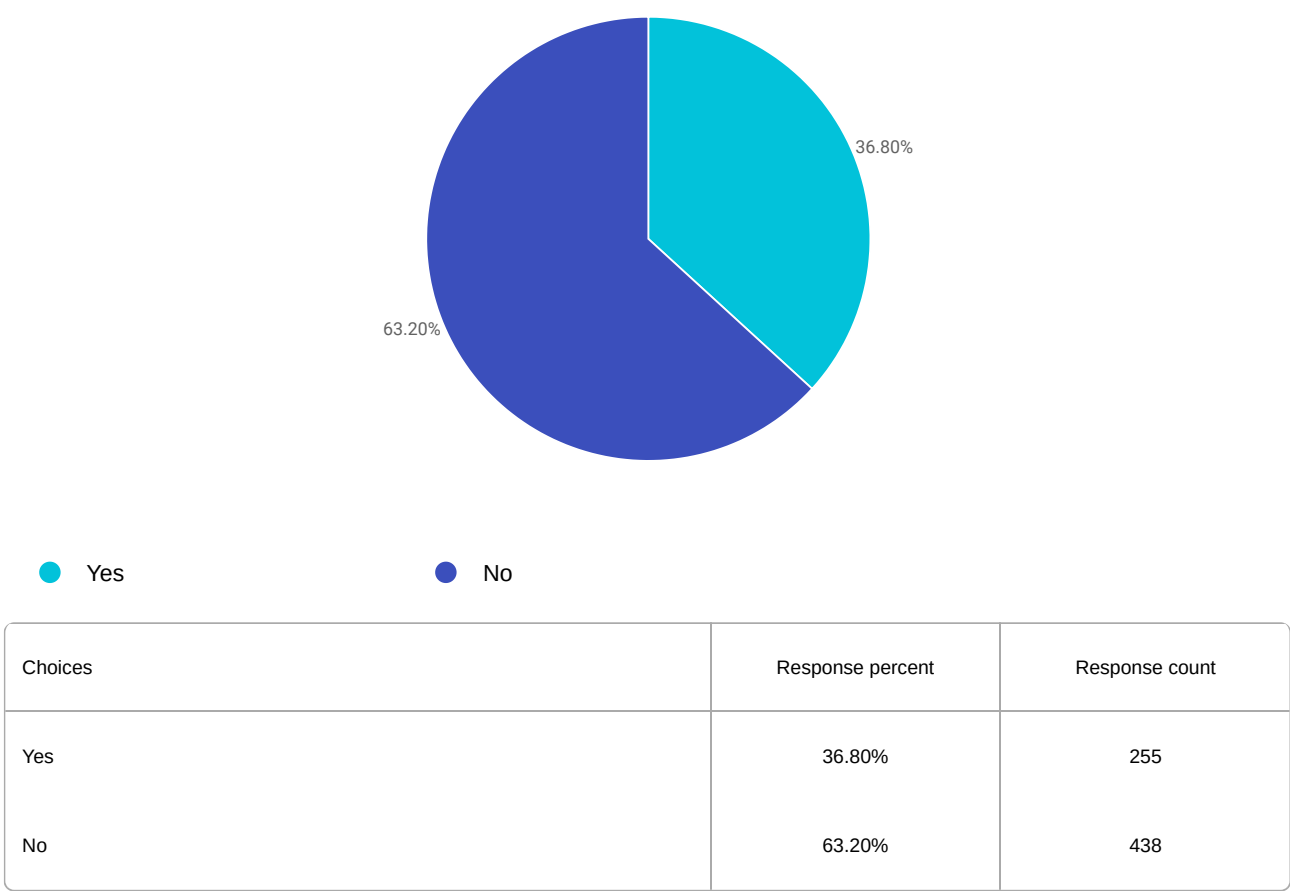

Have you attended a Township meeting regarding the proposed data center?

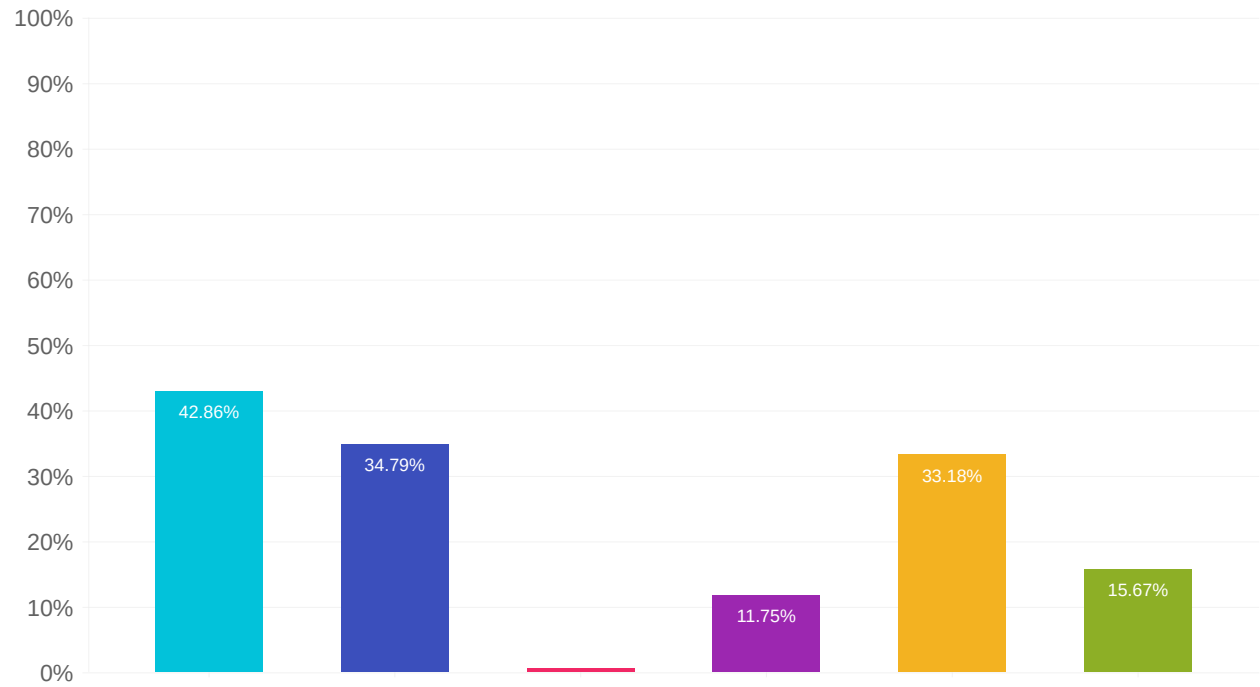

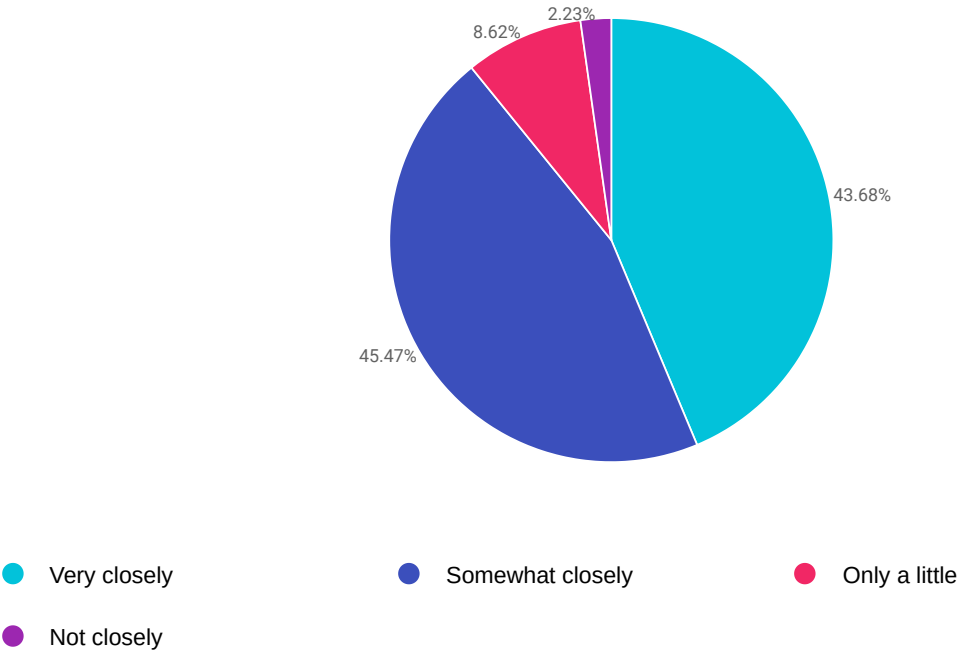

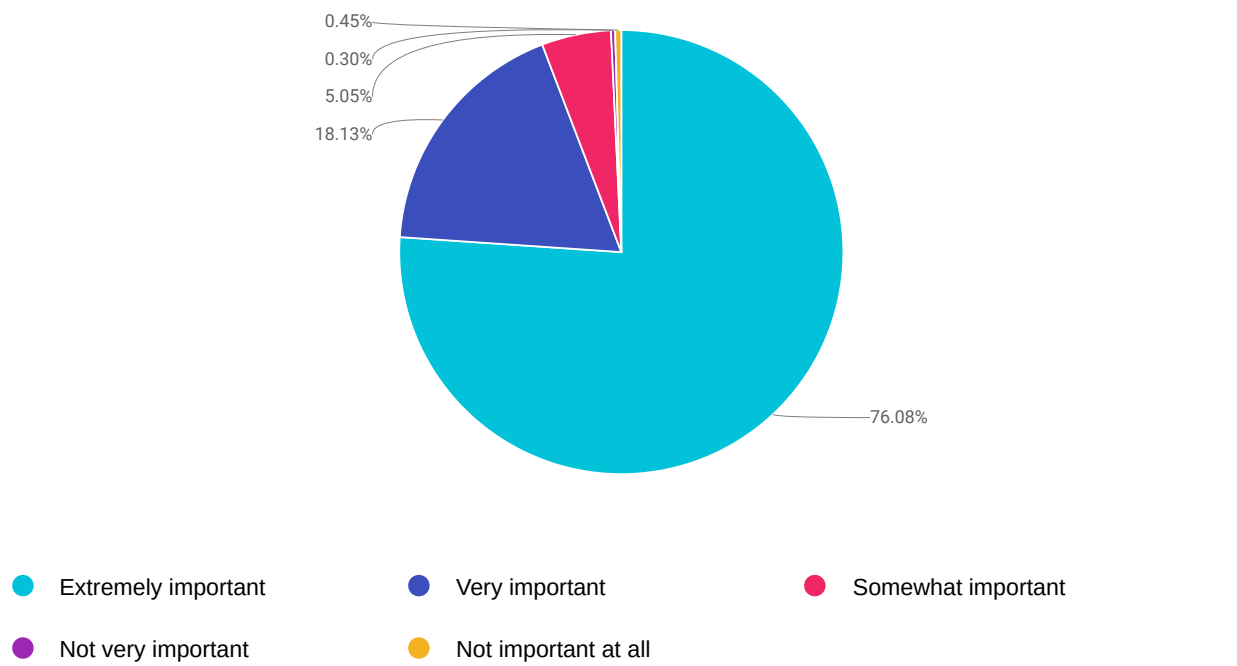

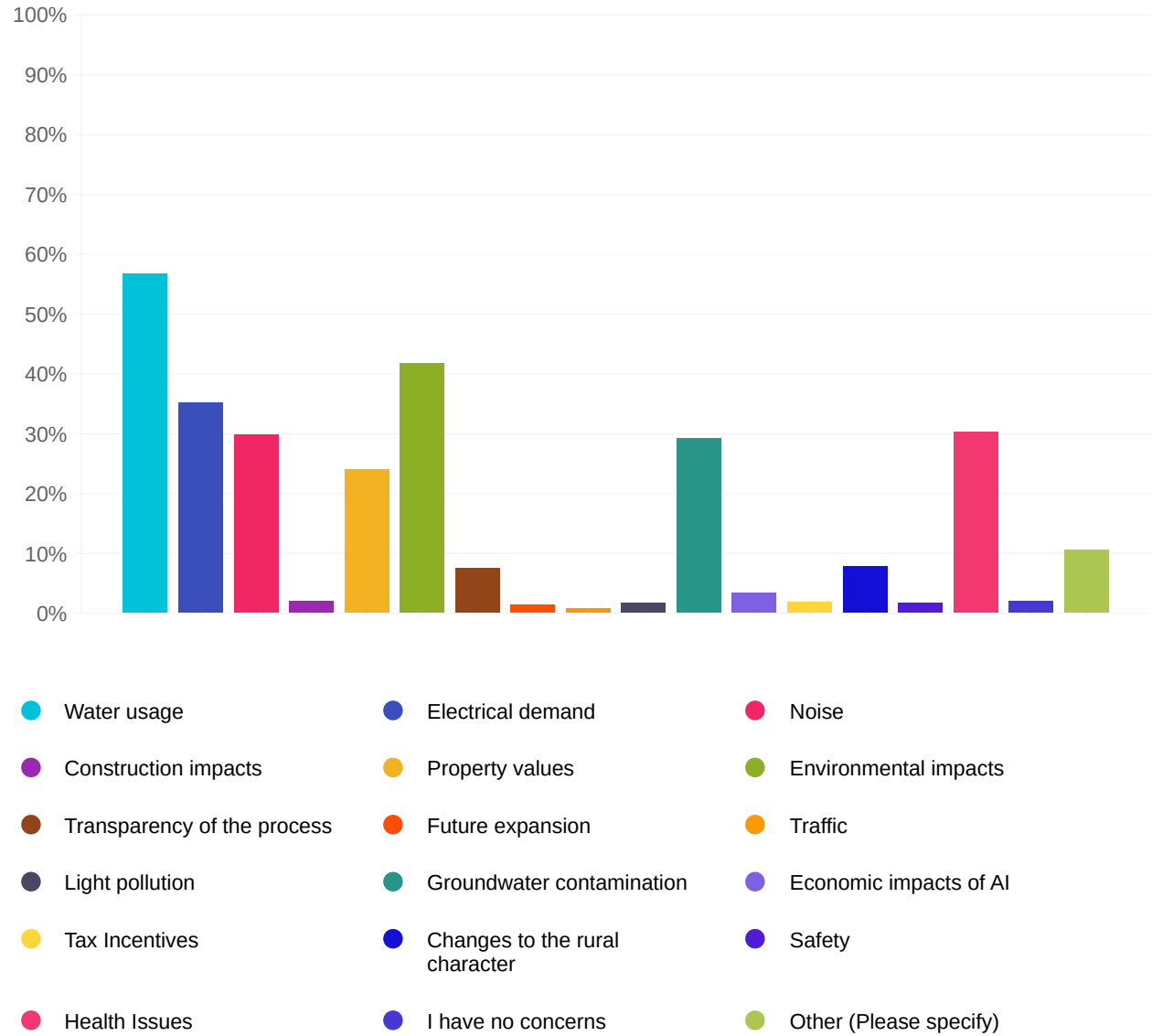

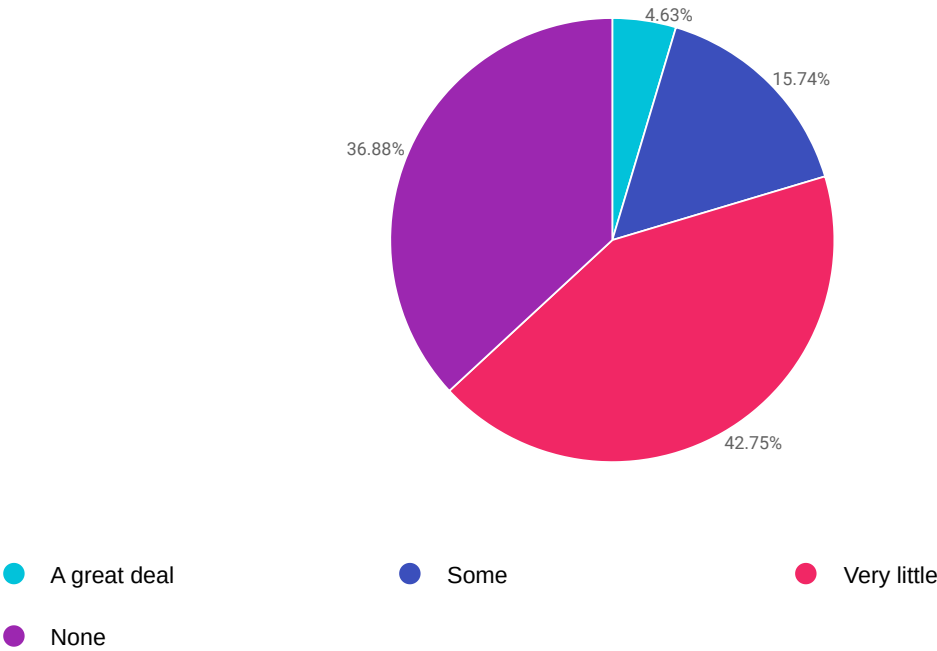

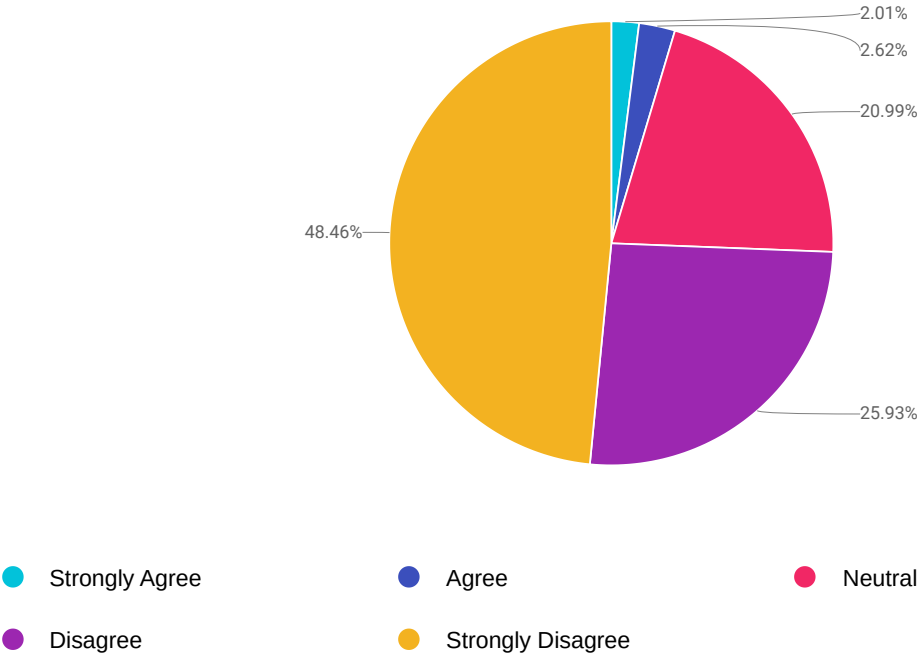

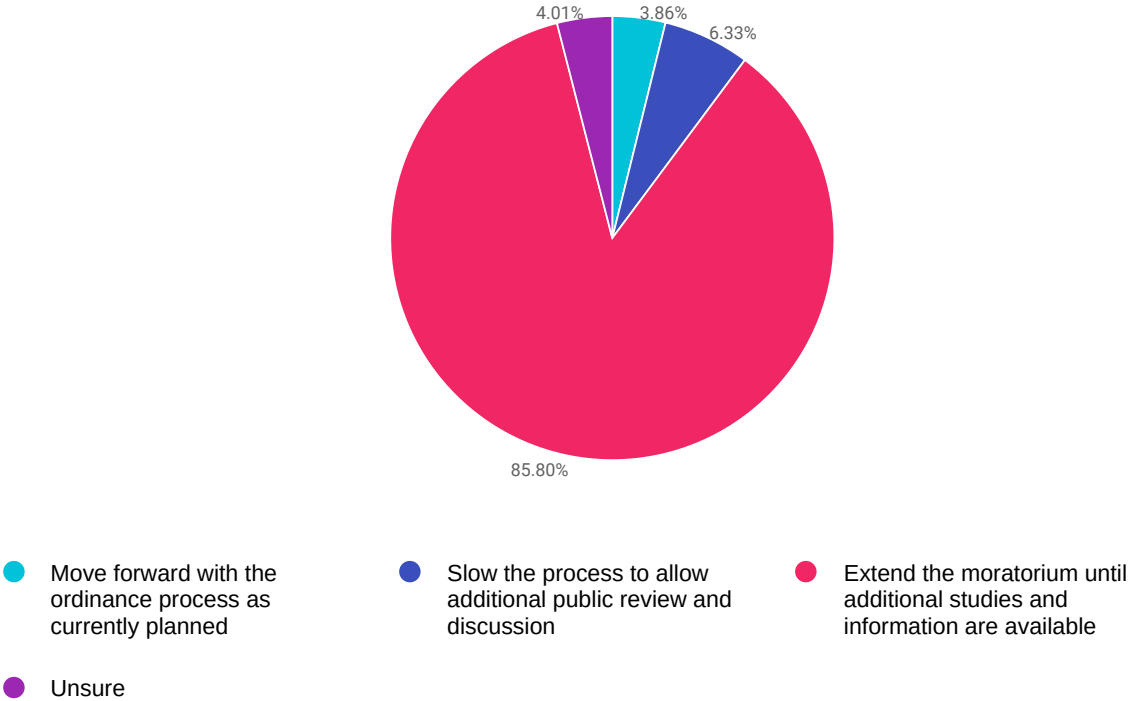

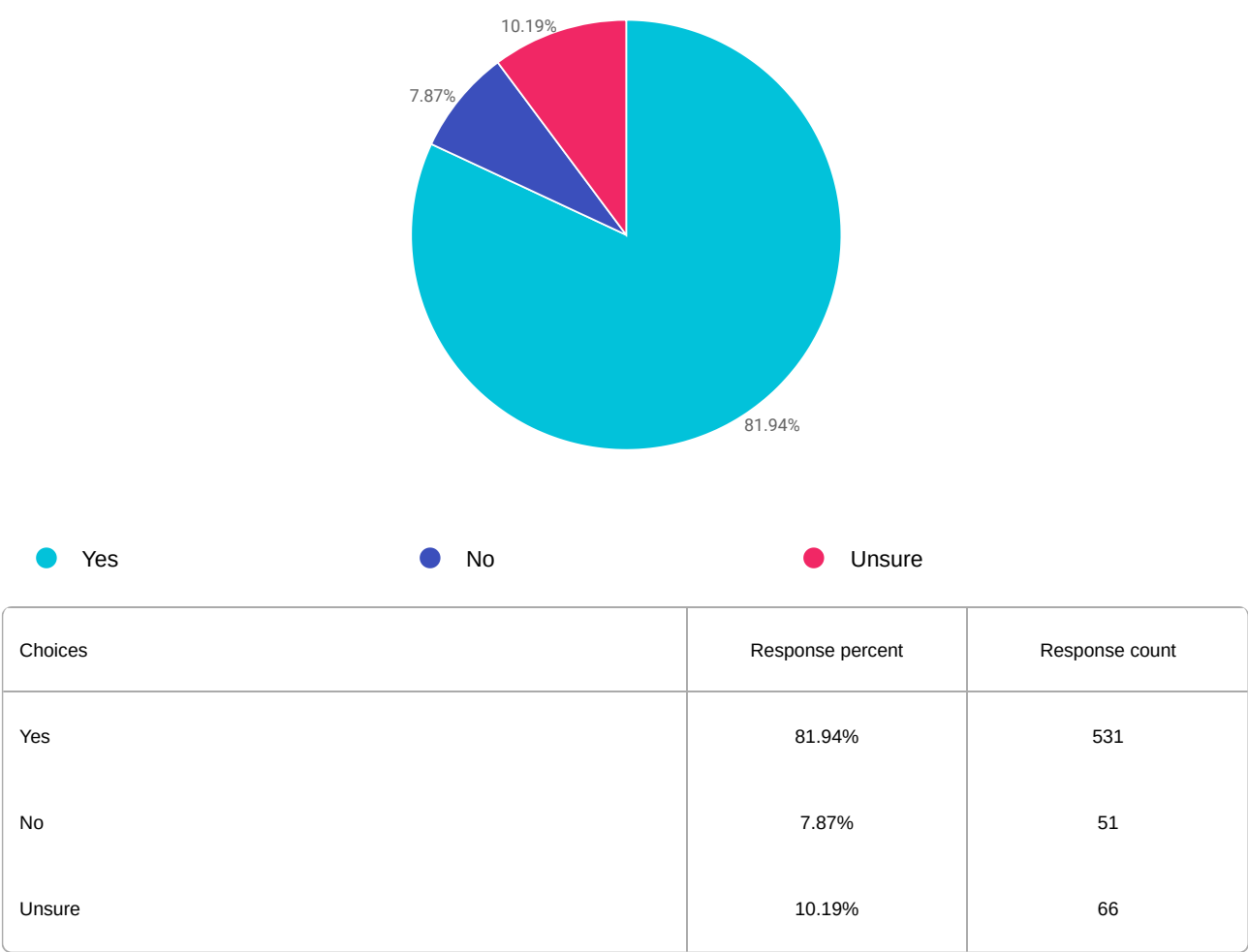

Would you support the Planning Commission holding a public workshop or working session dedicated solely to answering questions regarding the data center ordinance before moving further toward adoption?

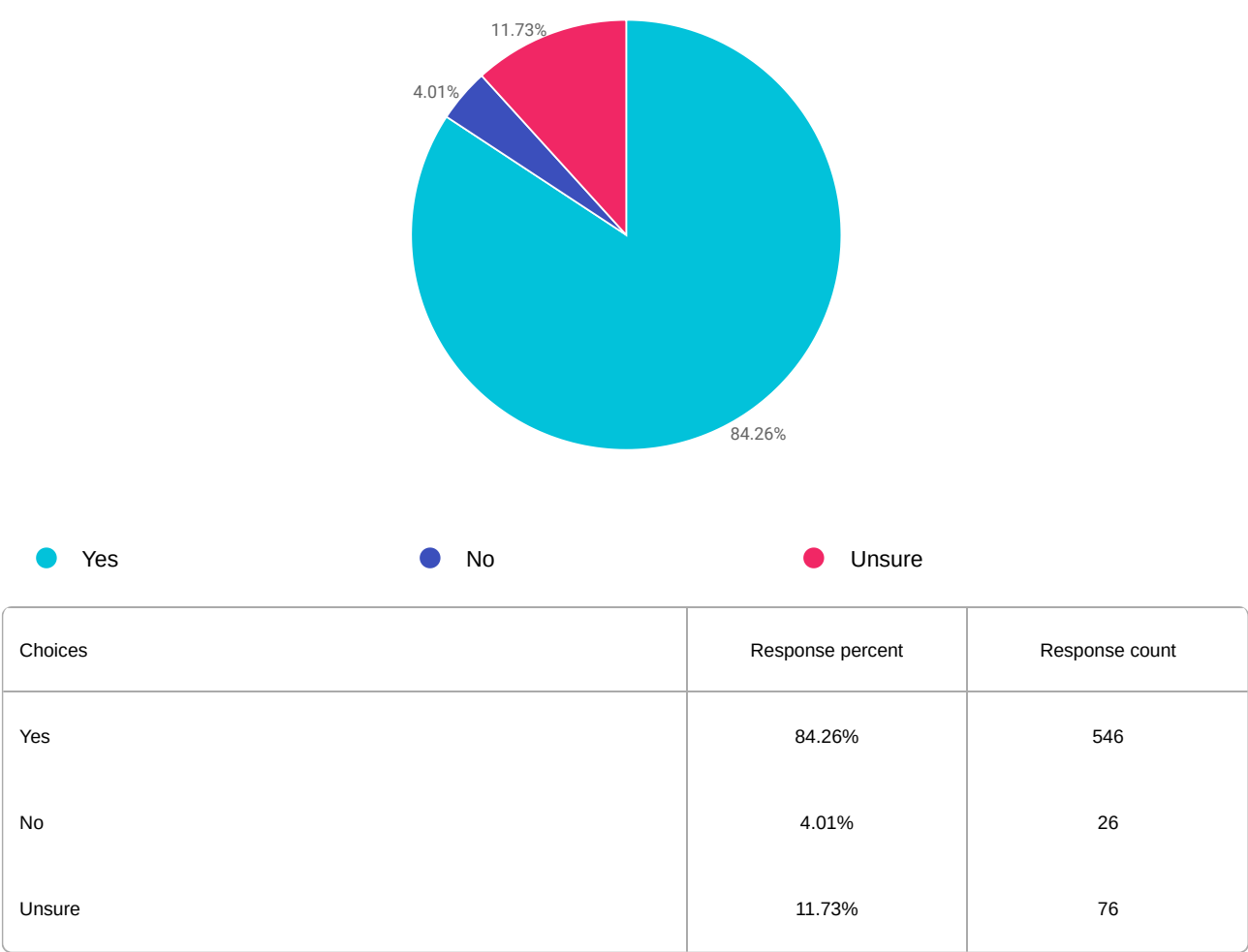

If the Township Board adopts a data center ordinance that you believe does not adequately protect residents, would you support allowing Township voters to approve or reject that ordinance through a referendum?

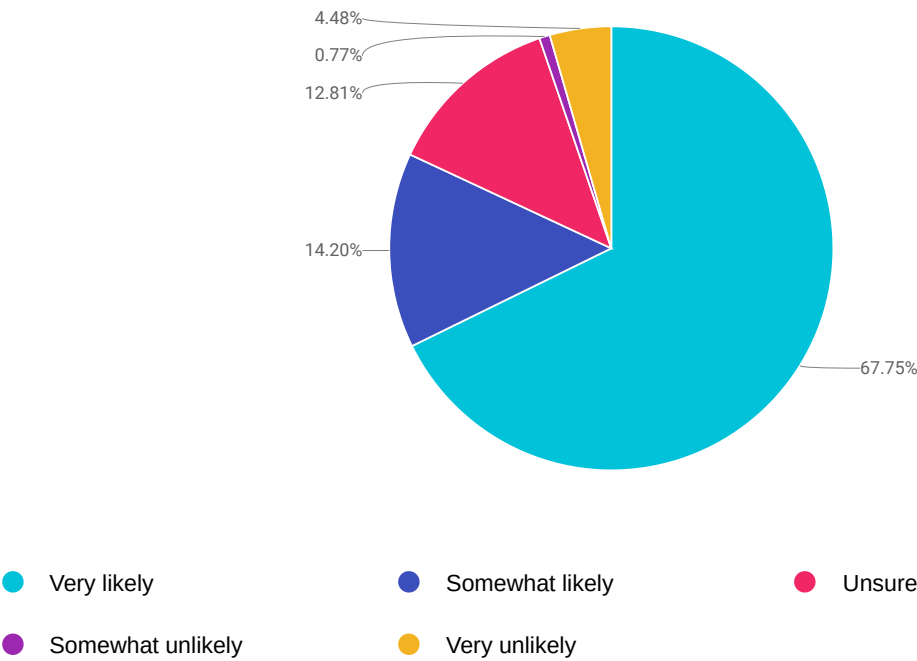

At the start of the meeting I suggest that someone, who is strong in the use of Roberts Rules, tell everyone that the meeting will be strictly run on Roberts Rules, and perhaps the disruptive citizens can be asked to leave. In my experience, as a former state employee who dealt with controversial issues at public meetings, having a policeman or sheriff officer present can be help keep the raucous crowd more reserved.
61. We are not opposed to a data center on principal, but we do not want the presence of one to change the character of the area in which we live. Our home is located along the southern border of the proposed data center. We have concerns about its potential impact on wildlife, our home value, utility demand and rate increase, and overall noise/light pollution. The quality of water in our area has already been negatively impacted by PFAS – what measures are going to be put in place to prevent further contamination of our groundwater? We live in the township of Algoma and have concerns that the impact to the land south of 16 mile as part of the proposed data center site is being overlooked.

62. There are multiple reasons that AI centers negatively impact our society. They are detrimental to our environment. Electric: EMFs negatively affect the nervous system causing headaches, sleep disorders, and fatigue from prolonged exposure. There are correlative studies of risks of cancer, hormone alterations, and heart rate alterations with prolonged exposure. There is a potential for stray or high voltage output harm to humans and animals (see lawsuits in Michigan for beef and pork producers). This should be further researched with data centers. Miscarriages to both livestock and farmers wives resulted in the phenomenon. This can also affect our own electricity supply and potentially damage home electronics. Aquifer level loss: The volume of water required to run these centers is staggering, and the loss of water supply for drinking and watering agricultural fields, along with pollutants in drinking water becoming higher in concentration is a grave concern. These centers can drain our aquifers potentially resulting in sink holes. Who will stand by our people and pay to have our wells drilled deeper? Who will pay for sinking homes? When the water is depleted, I'm sure the company will literally and figuratively leave us "high and dry." Wildlife: Habitat of wildlife will be lost. Water discharged is often warmer and may contain contaminants. Warm water breeds bacteria and fungi. Noise pollution: The National Wildlife Federation reports that constant noise disrupts wildlife communication and elevates stress levels of all living creatures. Light pollution: These center run on a continuous duration. This can disrupt wildlife circadian cycles, especially for nocturnal animals. For human who live close by, this ca also disrupt sleep. Once this mammoth center is built, there is no going back. The damage done will be irreparable, and there will be no recourse for the people. This community needs to take a long look to discover and weigh the risks and benefits. Waiting might mitigate adverse effects while other solutions are developed that would serve us all better. There is no risk of waiting but going forward carries many risks. Wait and compare how other communities have fared. Other communities have either initiated a moratorium or better yet, put the issue on a ballet. No few people should have the right to make such an enormous decision that affects so many. We the people in this area (Solon and surrounding townships) have moved here to escape the treacheries of the city. This is our home, our peace. The lack of transparency and resistance to collaboration with the Twp residents is only making this process more difficult and expensive for everyone.

Once it is allowed, there's no saying how many changes can happen in the future and expansion that can happen in the future. I can get out of control very quickly.  89. Is it necessary for providing internet or a.i. availability- we think not. Let's have a nature center instead with a \$2 per visit fee and save some of the rural/ agrarian charm of our region.
 90. The area has recently been rocked by the revelation of PFAS in the water table. We don't need another threat to our water supply.
