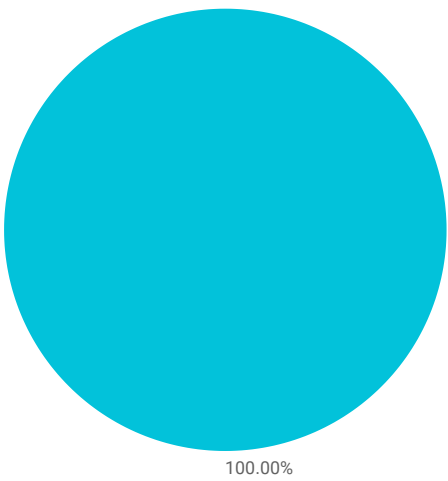

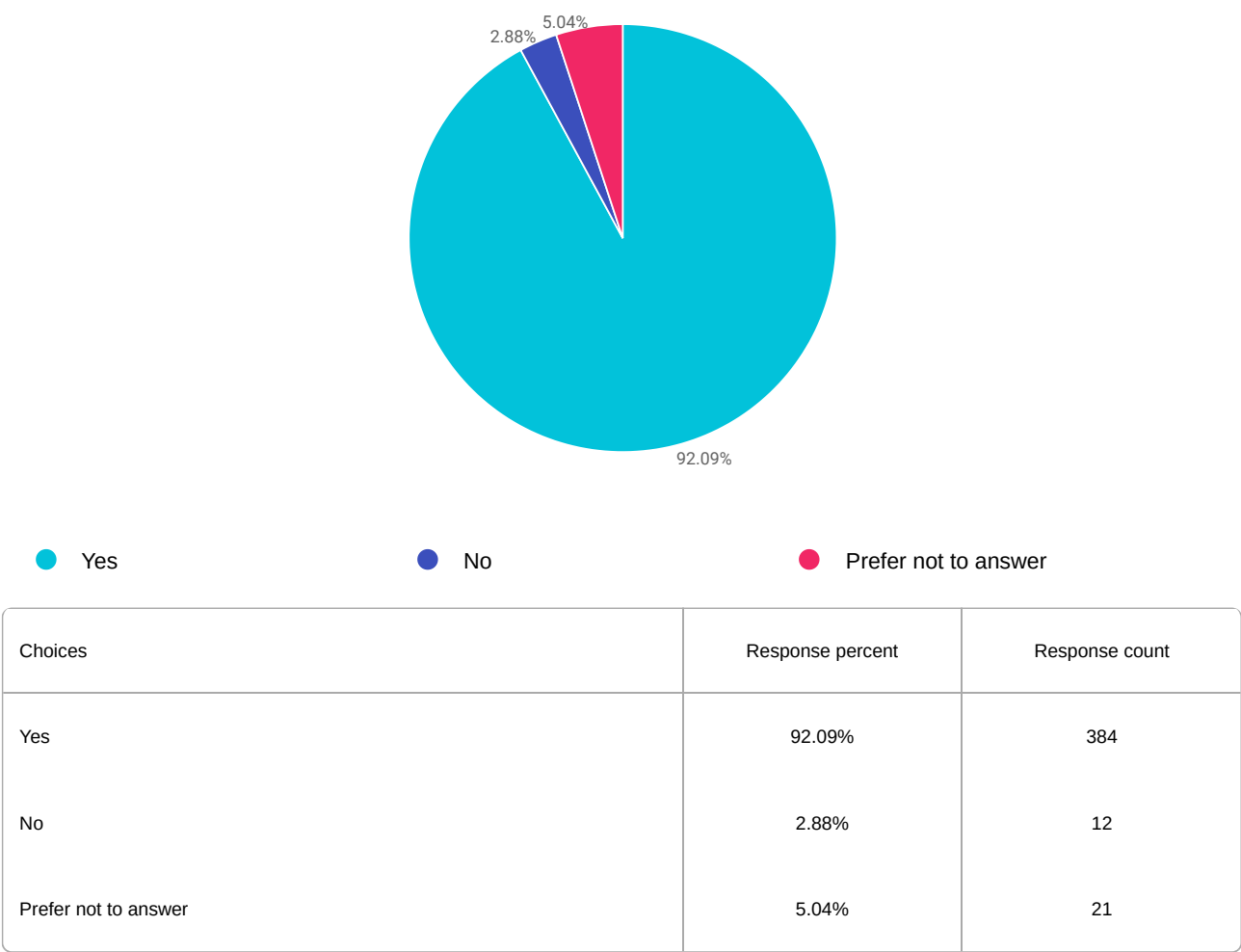

Are you a registered voter in Solon Township?

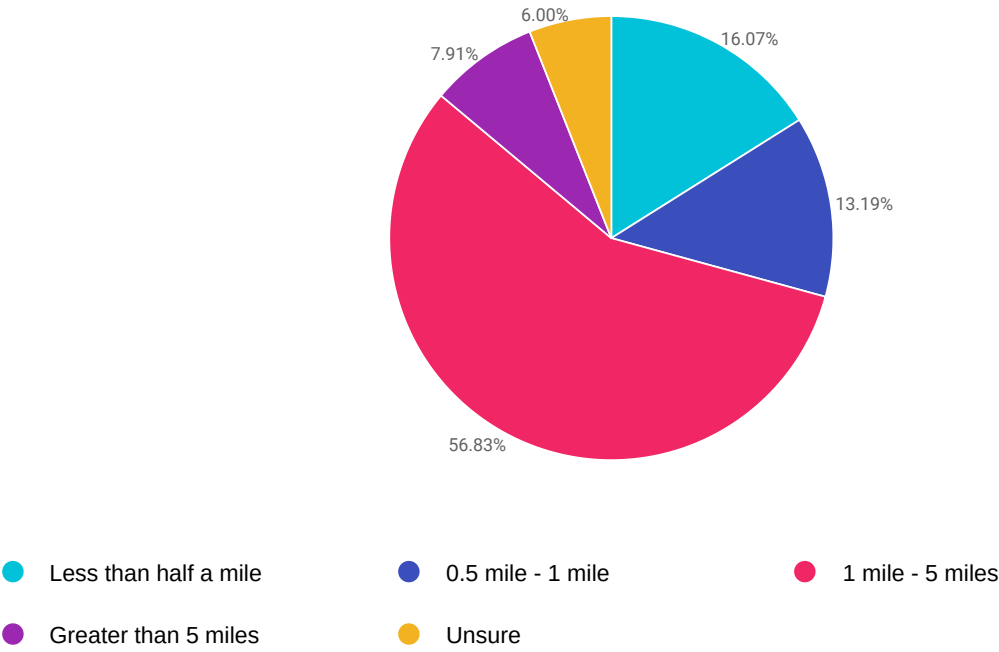

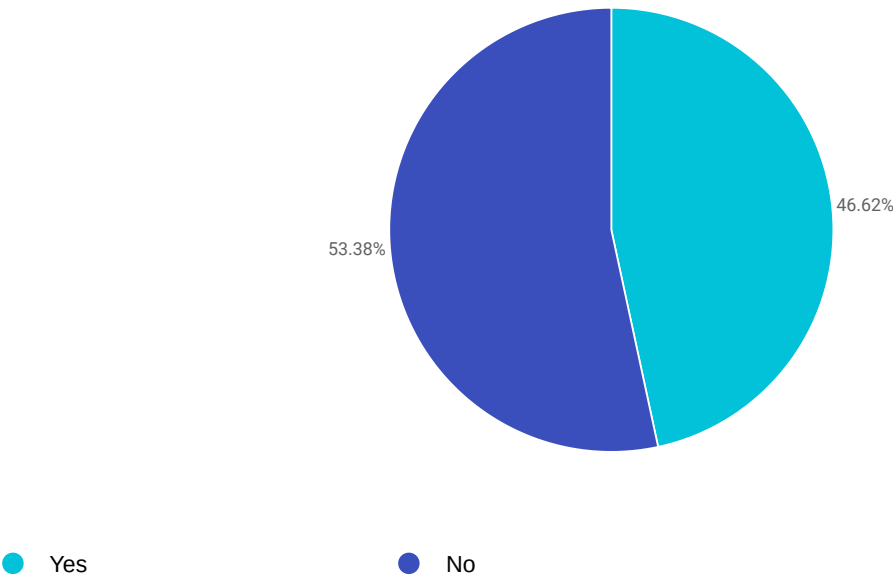

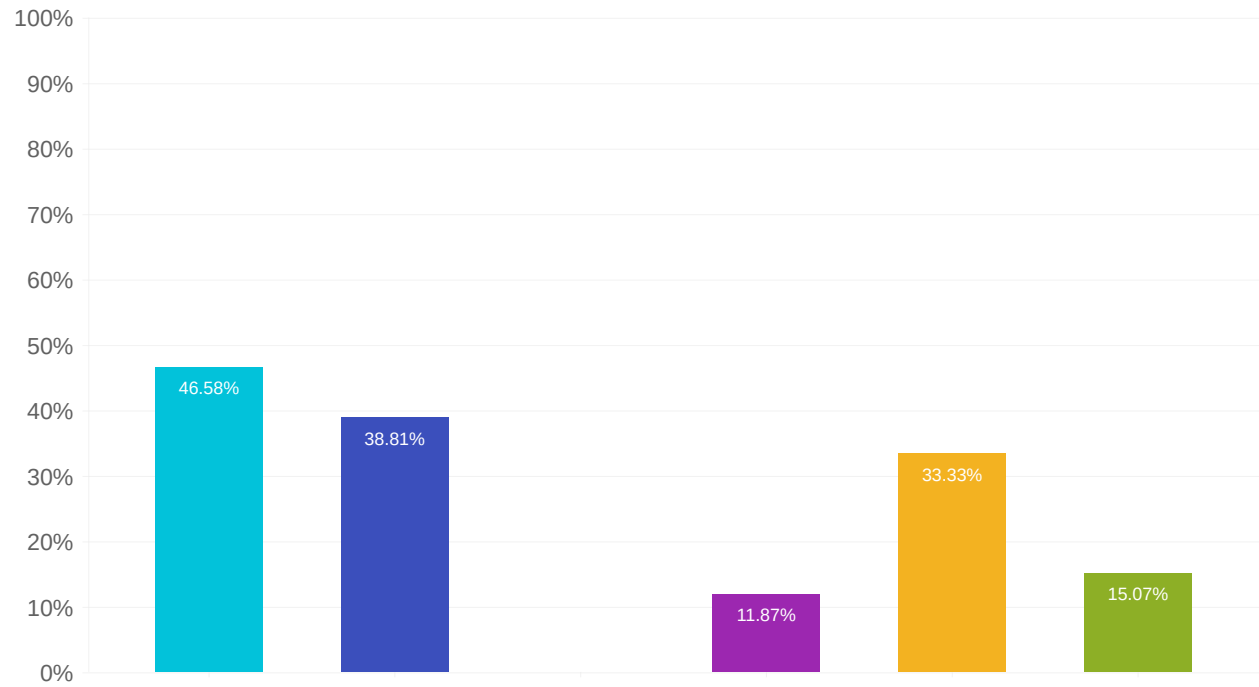

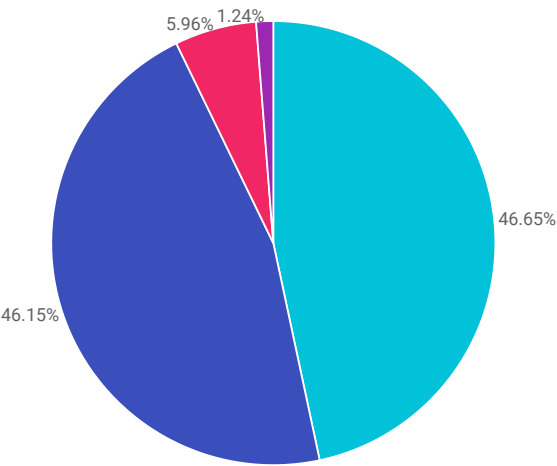

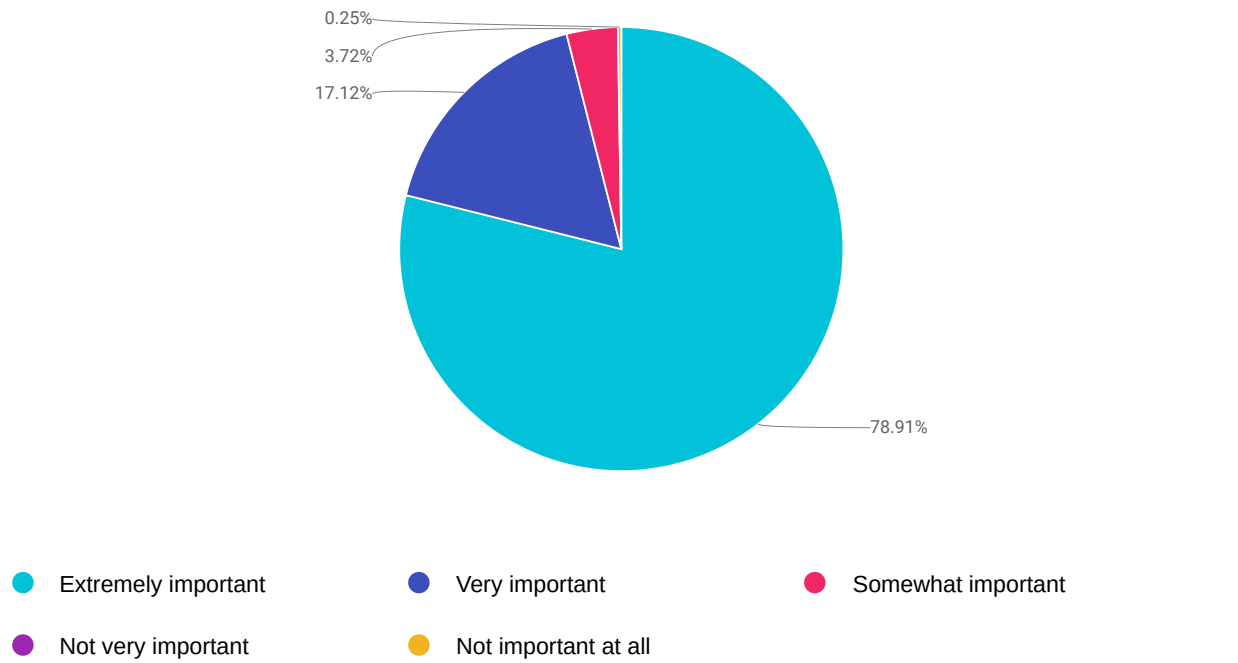

How important is this issue to you?

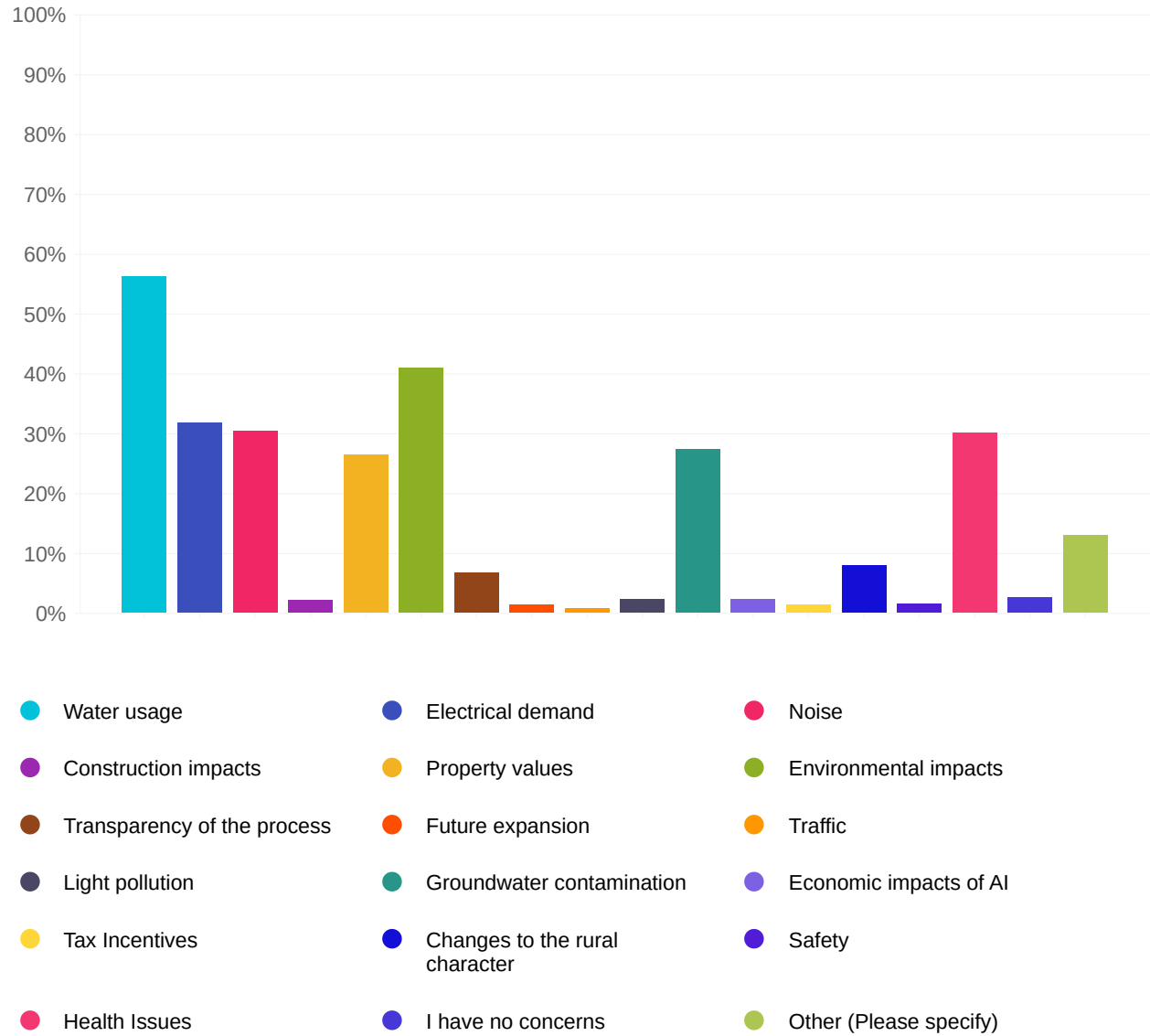

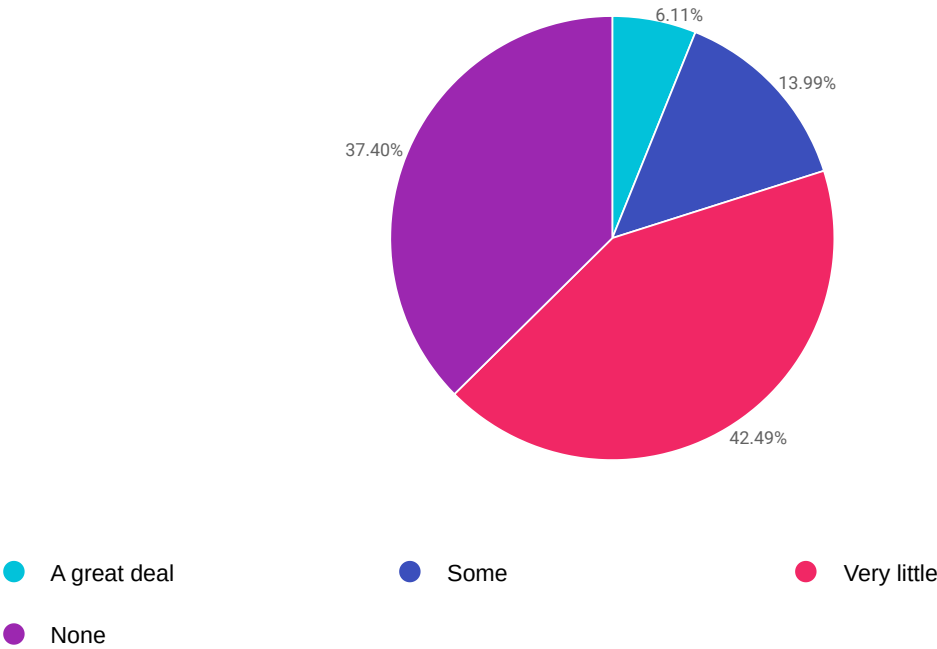

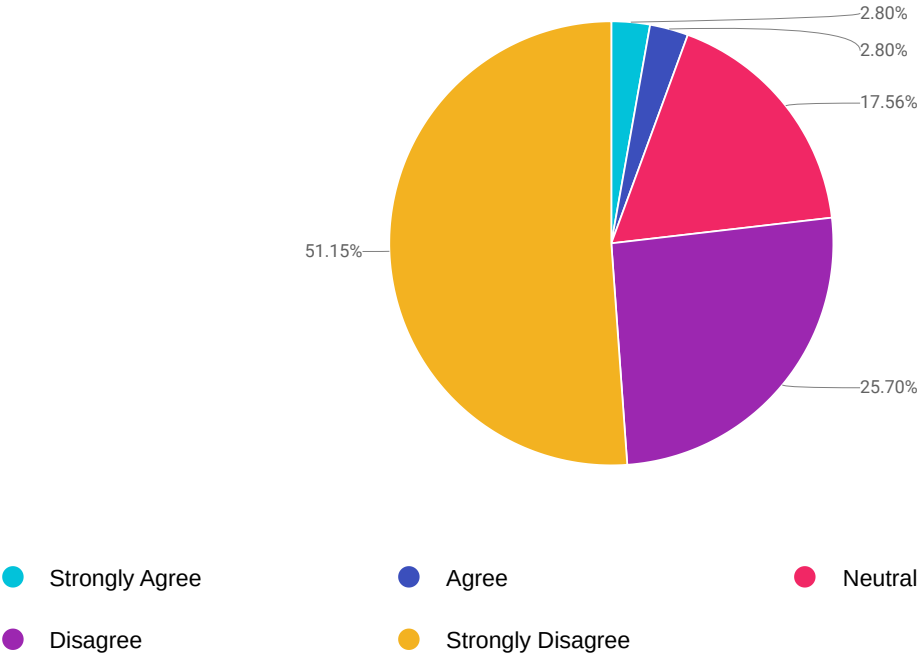

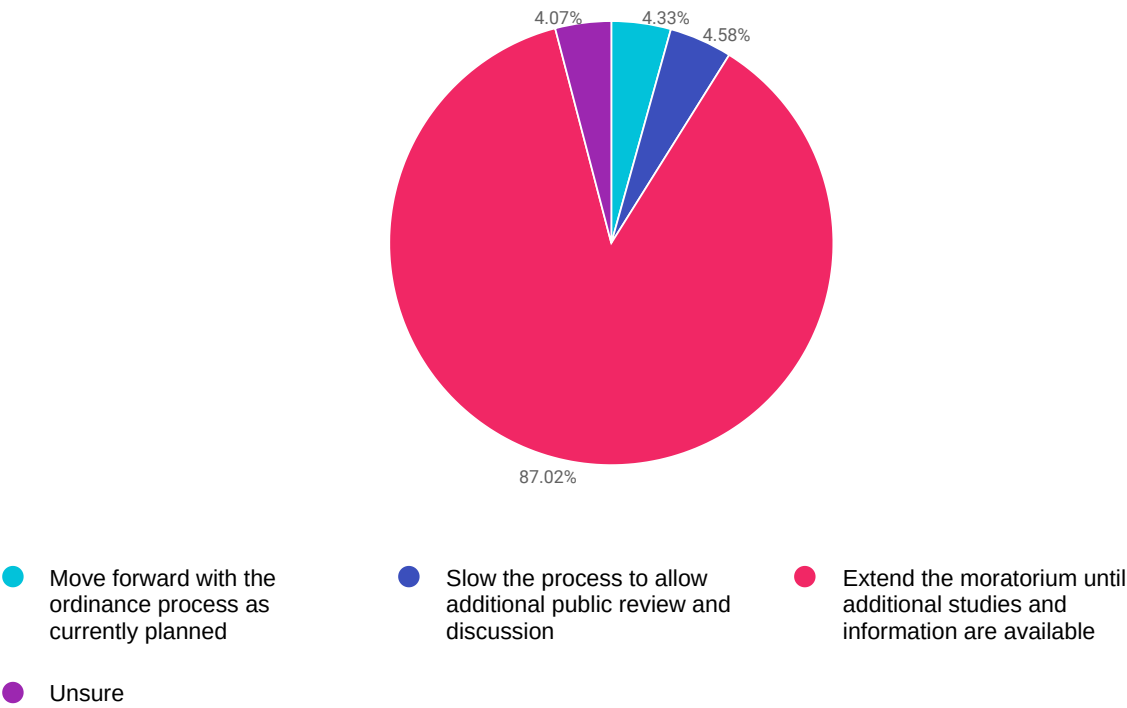

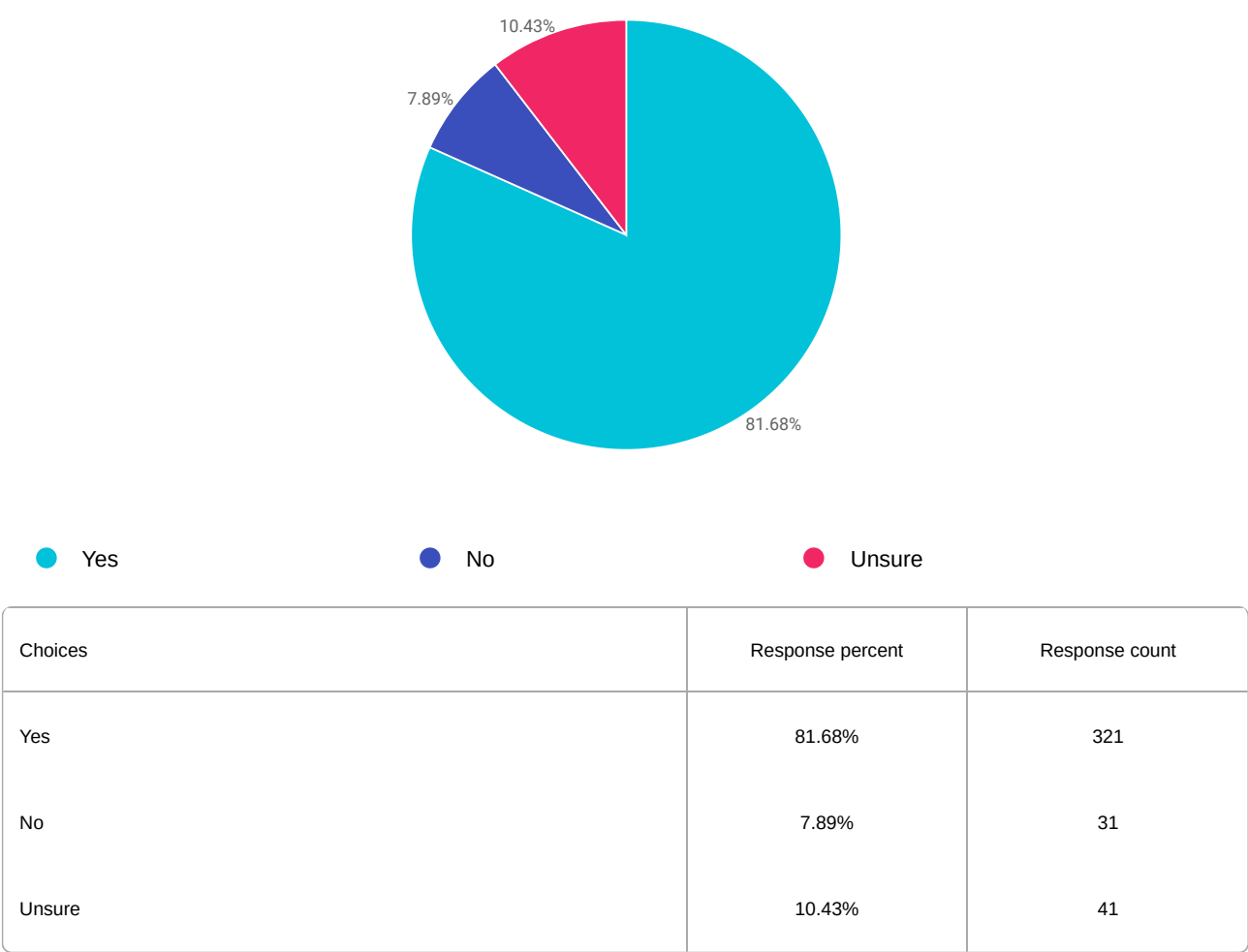

Would you support the Planning Commission holding a public workshop or working session dedicated solely to answering questions regarding the data center ordinance before moving further toward adoption?

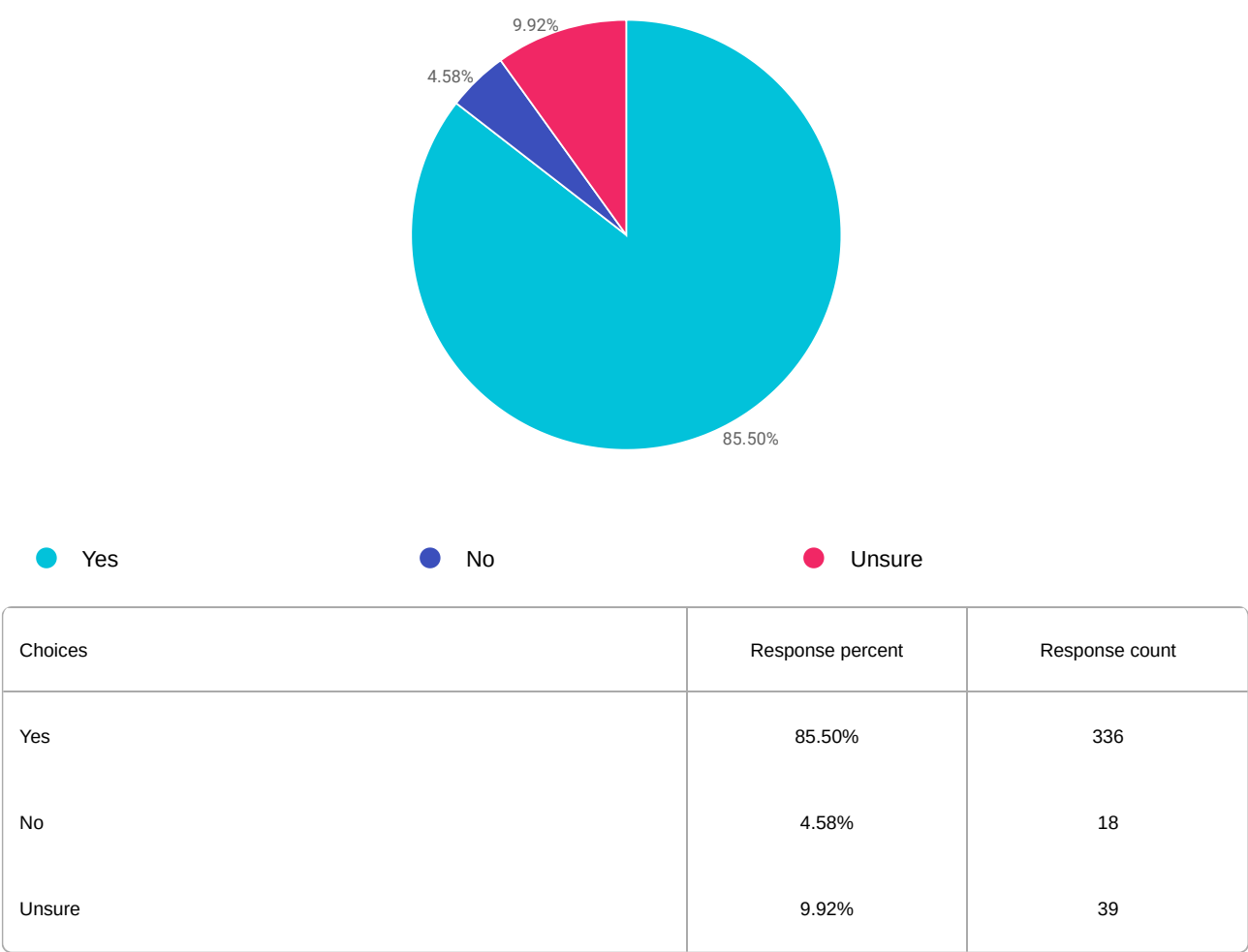

If the Township Board adopts a data center ordinance that you believe does not adequately protect residents, would you support allowing Township voters to approve or reject that ordinance through a referendum?

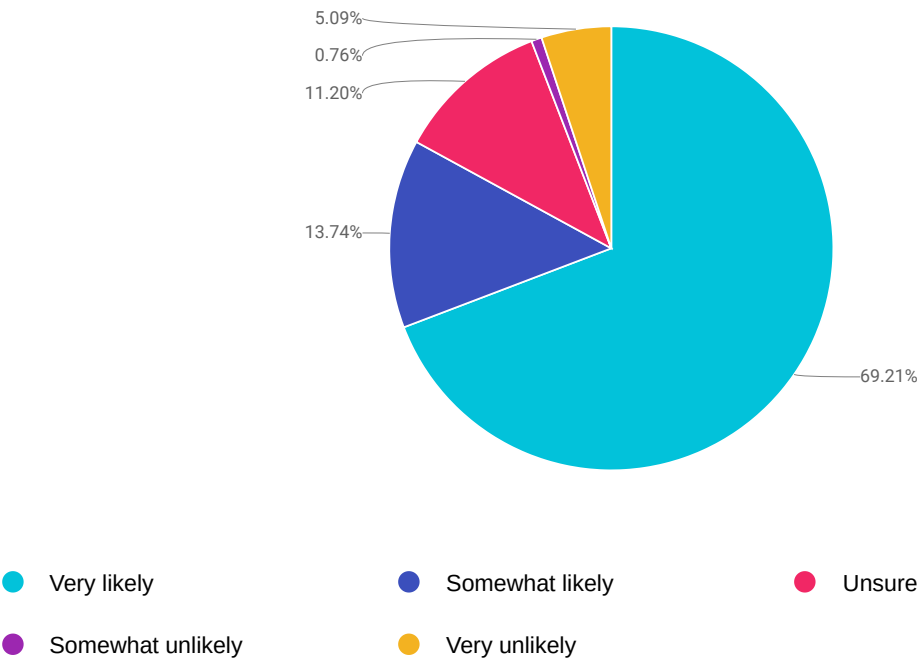

A more thorough review needs to be done as to the long-term effects this may have on our community and more stringent ordinances need to be constructed as far as limiting water resources, energy, etc. Transparency by the township board is a must and should they go against the communities wishes, they should be removed from their positions on the board.

64. It creates temporary jobs and only a few long term jobs. It's a resource drain and not worth it.
65. Data centers carry a massive climate footprint, increasing the cost of electricity and depleting already rapidly declining natural resources such as freshwater. It's estimated that by 2030, at the current rate of growth, AI data centers could add 22-44 million tons of CO2 equivalents. This will increase the global temperature by 2-4 degrees Fahrenheit, disrupting natural environments, killing our coral reefs, and dramatically shifting our seasons. AI data centers rely on freshwater for cooling purposes, since saltwater is corrosive and far too expensive to desalinate. Already, in communities where these data centers have been built, local populations no longer have access to safe, clean water. Even in centers that recycle their water, they still pose health risks and release dangerous levels of emissions and chemicals. It's important to think long term, rather than short. Money is obviously a huge factor in this decision, and it may be tempting to take the deal based on how much they offer you, but to do so would be a disservice to the community of Solon Township. Saline Township has already been bought out by these data centers, don't let that be Solon. If this board truly cares about the people of Solon Township, and about the future of their own grandchildren or children, then they wouldn't allow a data center to be built here. I'm begging you all, please do some actual research on these data centers and how detrimental they can be- and from reliable sources at that, such as sites ending in .gov or .edu. While the effects of these data centers on the local population is not yet fully studied, the issues they've already began to cause should be proof enough that they're no good for people nor the environment.
